Record of discussion of the review Meeting taken by the Principal Secretary / Irrigation & Waterways Department on 17.02.2022 at Jalsampad Bhawan, Salt Lake to discuss on Premonsoon allocation of maintenance fund, processing of D.P.Rs for RIDF-28, processing of D.P.Rs of SMI schemes and anti erosion schemes under Central Assistance, identification of ponds near irrigation canals having potential for storing canal water and identification of sites for stacking e.g. emergent flood fighting materials.

 - The item-wise deliberations by the Chief Engineers and the decisions taken there for are as stated below:-

A. Pre-monsoon allocation (CE wise) of maintenance fund under AE and SDS.

a. Commenting on the tentative allocation of SDS maintenance fund (Total Rs. 100 Crore as attached with the today's meeting notice) the CE(S-W) stated that additional allocation of Rs. 1.50 Crore is required for K.C. Division-II. Other CEs also requested to increase their respective allocations in the context of non availability of SDRF fund.

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b. Decision:- A CE wise revised allocation Rs. 104.19 Crore of SDS maintenance fund for taking up urgent pre-monsoon repair works was approved in the meeting and is attached herewith as Annexure-I. The concerned CEs will prioritize the works within the allocation and send division wise list of works with corresponding cost to the DS-IV through email within next 10 days. A Go-Ahead for inviting tender on the prioritized list of works will be accorded thereafter from the Department.

B. Allocation for proposed works under RIDF-28:-

- a. The C.E. wise tentative allocation (Total Rs.436 Crore) under RIDF-28, attached with the meeting notice was discussed at length inviting comments from the respective C.Es. The C.E.(South) and the CE(M&E) proposed for additional allocations for Rs.6.25 Crore and Rs. 4.50 Crore respectively for taking up schemes relating to bank protection work of Thakuran river and rehabilitation of Kultali Sluice. The C.E.(S-W) requested to give flexibility of interchange of allocations against Irrigation and Flood Sectors keeping the total CE wise allocation same.
- b. Decision:- Accordingly, a C.E. wise revised allocation of Rs. 446.75 Crore was finalized in the meeting and the same is enclosed at Annexure-II. The C.E.s were requested to submit D.P.Rs within the allocated amount to the S.E./I.P.C-I within 30 days after prioritizing of schemes. While doing so, the interpadjustment between the allocations against Irrigation and Flood Protection Sector is permitted. The rehabilitations of flood damages should be given top most priority. The concerned S.E.s and C.E.s will visit the sites of at least 10% and 5% of the schemes respectively (selected randomly) proposed under RIDF-28 during scheme preparation and convey their suggestions to the concerned E.Es. Certificate from the S.E.s and C.E.s in this regard should be attached with the selected D.P.Rs.

C. Review of progress of submission of D.P.Rs of Surface Minor Irrigation Schemes (SMI) for posing under Central Assistance:-

- a. The C.E.(S-W) informed that out of 18 preliminary selected SMI schemes under his jurisdiction, the D.P.R of Karu Irrigation Scheme has only been submitted to S.E/IPC-I for further processing, 7 schemes have been found not feasible, 2 schemes have been included and D.P.Rs of 8 schemes are under preparation. The C.E(N) informed that out of 9 preliminary selected schemes under his jurisdiction, design of 6 schemes is ongoing at CDO and D.P.Rs of 3 schemes have been sent to S.E./IPC-I.
- b. Decision:- The processing of submitted D.P.Rs at S.E/IPC-I at State TAC should be initiated by S.E/IPC-I within next 10 days. The C.E(S-W) and the C.E(W) were asked to submit the D.P.Rs to the S.E/IPC-I for other schemes at the earliest. Selection of SMI schemes other than those in the list of primarily selected 27 schemes (if found feasible) is permitted.

D. Review of progress of submission of D.P.Rs of coastal protection works for posing under Central Assistance:-

- a. It emerges from the discussion that preparation of D.P.Rs for Coastal Protection Works, as per the guidelines of Central Water Commission, GoI, requires extensive prior survey, data accumulation and their analysis and hydraulic/structural design. The concerned working divisions may not be in a position to carry out such complex survey, analysis and design.
- b. It was decided that River Research Institute may be contacted to carry out the required survey data accumulation, analysis and fixing technical specifications. The D.P.Rs may be prepared thereafter by the concerned working division based on the inputs from RRI.

E. Stacking of Emergent Flood Fighting materials:

- a. The C.E(S) and the C.E(N-E) informed that stacking of earth for emergent repair in not required for Sundarban areas and North Bengal respectively. The C.E(S-W) and the CE(W) informed that 31 and 3 such spots within the respective jurisdictions have been identified so far.
- b. Decision:- The C.E.s were asked to finalise the list of such stacking points immediately and send the list to the Director Advance Planning for incorporating the same in the Flood Mitigation Plan. The excavated earth from Muriganaga dredging may be included in the same list.

F. Misc issues:-

Decision:- The C.E.(TBP) was asked to expedite the mutation of acquired land of TBP in consultation with the concerned D.Ms with top priority.

Notes:

- 1 This allocation is for Pre-monsoon of 2022-23. Priority will be given to the palliative repair work that was undertaken during the last monsoon and repair of the sluice etc. in the Canal Irrigation network.
- 2 Hired Inspection Vehicle, Security & Guarding & office up-keepment expenditure should not be included.
- One time cleanning of drainage channels may be included as new SDS schemes. The AMC of the same may be excluded. The AMC of the drainage channels is to be done out of AE maintenance budget. CE-wise requirement of fund for the same is to be e-mailed to DS-IV within 5 days from the issue of this ROD.
- 4 CEs are requested to finalize a priority list as per the allocation provided above and submit division wise sub allocation amount to DS-IV through e-mail within next 10 days. The allocation of CE(D&R) is related to taking up maintenance of I.T. infrastructure, emergent survey works, soil sample collection from river/canal beds.
- 5 The tenders of the works within the above allocation may be floated after accordance of a Go-Ahead from the Department on the priority list.
- The schemes are to be submitted for obtaining Administrative Approval in OPMS in the usual manner followed in previous year.
